

Be ready. As soon as he comes and knocks, they will open to him.

What a joy to realize that, even unworthy and a sinner, it will be up to me to open the door for the Lord, when He finally comes. Yes, at the hour of death, I will open the door to Heaven, or I will close it; nobody will be doing it on my behalf.

When I respond in appropriate ways even

in diverse circumstances, I am rewarded or else proportionately punished, for being inattentive. To be waiting wide-awake at my door for him to arrive is quite simple, and I can certainly do it. I must not be negligent.

Christians are never compass less castaways, they know where they come from, where they are going and how to get there; they know their destination, the means to reach it and the difficulties to be found on the way. To bear all this in mind will help us to be watchful and open the door when our Lord will warn us. Exhortations to vigilance and responsibility are often repeated in Jesus' preaching for two clear reasons: because Jesus loves us and He "watches" over us. He, who loves, does not fall asleep and, because the devil, our enemy, keeps on tempting us. Thinking of heaven and hell should not detract us from our duties down here, but it is healthy and incarnated thought, and it deserves the Lord's admiration.

Millions facing starvation in East Africa

CAFOD, the Church's overseas aid and development charity, warns that up to 20 million people are fighting for their lives in Ethiopia, Kenya and South Sudan.

This is down to the spiralling cost of food and the fact that the region is facing the worst drought in 40 years.

Communities in the north of Kenya have been stretched beyond breaking point. Between October 2021 and March 2022, 1.5 million cattle and sheep died. For pastoralists, livestock are akin to a savings account – to see your animals die is the equivalent of having your life savings wiped out. Now, the people themselves are close to starving to death.


The Catholic Bishops of Kenya have launched their own appeal through Kenya's Church network but are concerned at the lack of interest from the international community. Father Ferdinand Lugonzo, "The Church is present. We bring out the facts to be the voice of the voiceless. This is bringing Laudato Si to life. We will do our part. I just appeal for you to donate as much as you can."

CAFOD has been working alongside communities across Kenya for over 30 years to help them cope better with emergencies – including three years of drought before this one. This crisis is so bad that now these resilient people and communities are under threat. But CAFOD says it will not give up.


